# RESOLUTION SUPPORTING LIGHT RAIL AND REGIONAL TRANSIT INTO KANNAPOLIS AND CABARRUS COUNTY

WHEREAS, need for expanding transportation choices and mobility options is critical as travel within and around Kannapolis, Cabarrus County and the greater Charlotte region is becoming more challenging due to the continued long term, rapid growth of our residential, business and tourism populations, which has led to worsening traffic conditions and longer travel times locally and regionally; and

**WHEREAS**, the US Census Bureau's 2015 LEHD Origin-Destination Employment Statistics indicates that 37,363 Cabarrus County residents are traveling into Mecklenburg County each weekday for work, and 15,313 Mecklenburg County residents are traveling into Cabarrus County each weekday for work; and

**WHEREAS**, the Charlotte region is home to over 1.8 million people and is expected to grow to over 2.5 million by 2030; Cabarrus Country's population is projected to grow over 60% by 2037; and

WHEREAS, a key to supporting this economic and population growth is a high capacity rapid transit system and regional transit mobility network integrated with land-use planning and economic development efforts to provide congestion mitigation, improve air quality, and foster a sustainable, economically vibrant and livable community environment which improves the quality of life and attracts businesses and people to Kannapolis, Cabarrus County and the region; and

WHEREAS, the cities of Kannapolis and Concord, in partnership with Cabarrus County, are completing the 20-year Cabarrus County Long Range Public Transportation Plan, which identifies the need to extend into Concord and Cabarrus County the Charlotte Area Transit System's (CATS) Lynx Blue Line Light Rail line, as well as develop other forms of rapid and local transit choices such as Commuter Rail (CR), and Bus Rapid Transit (BRT), to improve accessibility to and from Kannapolis, Concord, Cabarrus County and other parts of the Greater Charlotte area; and

**WHEREAS**, based on the North Carolina Strategic Transportation Investments (STI) Law, public transportation projects with service spanning two or more counties and serving more than one municipality are eligible for funding at the Regional Impact Tier; and

WHEREAS, the CATS Blue Line Light Rail has proven to be successful in stimulating economic growth and investment via Transit Oriented Development in excess of \$3.5 billion, the City of Kannapolis supports, at a minimum, an extension of the CATS Lynx Blue Line light rail corridor extending to The Grounds At Concord economic development site, as well as other High Capacity Transit options to potential locations in Kannapolis, Concord and Cabarrus County such as the North Carolina Research Campus, Charlotte Motor Speedway, the Concord Mills corridor and Concord-Padgett Regional Airport; and

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the City of Kannapolis supports an extension of the CATS Lynx Blue Line light rail corridor into Cabarrus County to The Grounds At Concord economic development site, as well as other High Capacity Transit options, including CR and BRT, to potential locations in Kannapolis, Concord and Cabarrus County, such as the North Carolina Research Campus, Charlotte Motor Speedway, the NC73-Kannapolis Parkway-Amazon corridor, the Concord Mills corridor and Concord-Padgett Regional Airport.

#### A. Action Requested by City Council

Motion to approve an Ordinance amending the Budget related to various Funds.

#### B. Required Votes to Pass Required Action

Majority present at meeting

#### C. Background

Budget Amendment 19-20 contains multiple amendments to the operating budget. These amendments occur in the General Fund, Water & Sewer Fund, Environmental Fund, and the CDBG / Home fund. The amendments are necessary in order to cover expected expenses for the remainder of the fiscal year (June 30th).

Water & Sewer Fund: These amendments will allow the city to pay for unexpected sewer treatment charges from WSACC (\$500,000); primarily due to inflow and infiltration (I&I). Also, the City must pay for some repairs to the meter reading system (\$200,000) in order to avoid non-reads of our water meters. Finally, their is a demand for more meter installations due to growth throughout the City. An appropriation of \$100,000 should cover our needs. We will be appropriating excess tap fee revenue that we have already received this year (\$100,000) as well as water and sewer cash reserves (\$800,000).

CDBG / Home Fund: We are budgeting excess revenue received this year in order to cover further urgent repairs throughout the City.

Environmental Fund: Due to increased costs in waste disposal and recycling penalties, the City needs to appropriate \$200,000 from the Environmental Fund cash reserves and receive an additional \$100,000 from the General Fund. The additional \$100,000 from the General Fund will come from the General Fund balance.

#### D. Fiscal Considerations

This amendment is required in order to make sure that each operating fund has enough money for anticipated expenses for the remainder of the fiscal year (June 30th).

#### PETITION FOR CLOSURE OF A 10 FOOT ALLEY

The undersigned was appointed as the general guardian for Shirley Jean Sweatte Perkins by the Cabarrus County Clerk of Court. A copy of the appointment has been attached hereto marked as Exhibit A and incorporated by reference herein as if full set out. She is the legal owner of the property know as 1005 Pine Ave, Kannapolis, NC and a separate track know as 1010 Birch St, Kannapolis, NC. A copy of her deed has been attached marked as exhibit B and incorporated herein. She made her home at the property until moving to an assisted living facility. The property in question was purchased by her mother and father about seventy years ago; she purchased the property from her parents. The property is divided into two separate tracts due to a 10 foot alley that was platted in 1924. A copy of the original plat has been marked as Exhibit C attached hereto and incorporated by reference as if fully set out. She is the sole owner of both tracks. The alley terminates at the eastern side of her property. The alley is one that is commonly referred to as a dead end.

Due to her medical condition, she is unable to live in the home and it necessary to sell the property. There was a contract to sell the property which was cancelled due to the alley way issue. A metes and bounds description of the alley has been attached here to marked as Exhibit D and incorporated by reference as if fully set out. The description was prepared by MEL G. Thompson and Associates. In addition, a recent surveyor of her property which shows the right of way marked as Exhibit E are incorporated by reference as if fully set out. The document was also prepared by Mr. Thompson.

This alley has never been opened from the date it was platted. In addition, there have been no state, city or county improvements to the alley from 1924 to present. There are no was, sewer, water or electric right of ways on the property that would require access. Due to the width of the alley, it is unlikely that a modern size sanitation vehicle could navigate the opening, and the alley is a dead end without a turning area. It is the guardian's desire to combine the two tracts into one tract with the alley way being part of the single tract with the Pine street address. The change is necessary to make the property more marketable and to satisfy the concerns of buyers and their lenders. The Beaver family whom we were instructed to contact by the City of Kannapolis has no objection to the closure and signed the petition.

The undersign is requesting that the city of Kannapolis close, abandon and deed the alley that extends across the property in question to Shirley Jean Sweatte Perkins.




