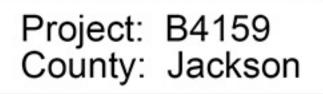

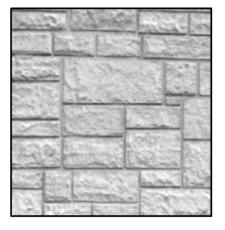

CITY OF KANNAPOLIS RESOLUTION APPOINTING MEMBERS TO THE DOWNTOWN ARCHITECTURAL REVIEW COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, the City of Kannapolis (the "City") is the owner and redeveloper of property located in the central business district of the City being a significant part of the downtown area (the "Property") and being shown in Map Book 68 at Pages 106 and 107 of the Cabarrus County Registry; and

WHEREAS, with the intent to preserve the character of the central business district, City has imposed certain restrictive covenants on the Property as set forth in the Declarations of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions recorded in Book 13983 at Page 302 (the "Declarations"); and

WHEREAS, in compliance with the Declarations, City is required to appoint an Architectural Review Committee (the "ARC") to regulate construction of and alterations to improvements located on the Property and establish and enforce guidelines (the "Guidelines") which are explanatory and illustrative of the general intent and vision of the City as it relates to architectural design, aesthetic style and quality standards.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City hereby establishes the Downtown Architectural Review Committee consisting of ______ initial members who shall represent the City consistent with the City Policy for Boards, Commissions and Committees, the Code of Ethics and such Bylaws as may be adopted by the City Council or its successors in interest.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the following persons are appointed as initial members of the ARC:
